Hangover 5 update

Obviously the race didn't go ahead on 1st Jan. A tree fell down on the course during the hours of the event, so we feel vindicated. We have a rearranged date of Bank Holiday **Monday**, **5**th **May**. This isn't ideal, as Worthing Runfest and 3 Forts Challenge are both the day before. However, we don't really have any other possible dates, so it's the view of the HO5 Planning Group that we go ahead and just try to make the best of it.

We will be desperately needing volunteers. Moreso, our usual Race Director and Mr HO5 – Bryan Darney – is away that weekend, so we're more desperate for volunteers (including a new Race Director) than ever.

Finances

The financial year for Gazelles is 1st February – 31st January. This is so that the accounts are ready for the AGM in mid-February, but also includes both the income and outgoings from the Hangover 5 on 1st January. (Obviously that's a little different this year with the postponed event).

Unfortunately, the accounts for this year aren't quite ready yet to be signed off, but we wanted to share with you some summary figures in the meantime. All figures rounded to the nearest pound just for ease.

This is only a small part of the picture, as:

- More refunds have been issued since our 'End Of Year' accounts period (£385)
- We have some on-the-day costs as well (e.g. portaloos)
- The College Parking was for last year, and they should be much cheaper this year due to the removal of the ANPR cameras

We currently have $\underline{\mathfrak{£}1,461.42}$ in our account. We also have an additional $\mathfrak{£}1,507.57$ in the savings account; totalling $\mathfrak{£}2,968.99$.

Why do we have a Savings account? At the last meeting, we chose to 'ringfence' the amount that the Hangover costs to host (roughly $\mathfrak{L}1.5K$), so that – if all else fails – we always just about have enough to host our main source of income.

Updates:

- Steve Pigott has decided to step down as Health and Safety Officer. A big thank you to
 Steve for the work he has done behind the scenes, especially in regard to the Hangover
- All others are happy to continue in their current position, assuming the club are happy for them to continue

- Would anyone like to fill the Health and Safety Officer role? This is a required role (as defined by England Athletics, as well as our Club Constitution) and is a Committee role.

- Charles is the 'Head Coach' as he is the only qualified coach in the Club and puts together the schedule. However, if Steve would like to, I'd like to suggest sharing this role with Steve Feest, as he leads the sessions more than anyone else.
- Are we happy to confirm everyone else?

Membership Fees for 2025/26

Fees for the membership period covering 1st April 2025 to 31st March 2026.

Our England Athletics fees are rising from £19 to £20 per individual, and £200 to £205 for the Club. We try really hard to keep the costs of membership down (we're cheaper than all the other local clubs), but all of our costs are rising, and the membership fees will probably need to reflect this for the long-term financial health of the Club.

We make no money on membership fees as, once the England Athletics fees and kit subsidy are taken into account, we actually make a loss on most members.

Current 2024/25 fees:

- Affiliated fees: £35 per year (that's £19 to England Athletics, £16 to the Club)
- Unaffiliated fees: £25 per year (all £25 to the Club)

Proposed fees(?):

- Affiliated fees: Small increase to £37.50 maybe? (That's a 7.1% increase; £20 to England Athletics, £17.50 to the Club)
- Unaffiliated fees: £27.50 per year? (That's a 12.50% increase; all £27.50 to the Club)

Can we still afford the kit subsidy? Is it fine now that most people have their one subsidised vest?

No matter what fees we decide, our commitment remains that financial cost should be no barrier to membership and participation with the Club. If you cannot afford this, please reach out to a member of the committee who will discuss options with you.

Run Leaders

A big thanks to our Run Leaders, on whom we are overly reliant. Fully qualified, we have:

Fully appreciate that others have kindly fulfilled the role of 'Run Leader', such as Rachel, Ian, Phina, Amelia and Meg to name just a few. However, ideally, we'd like our Run Leaders to be qualified and, importantly, insured.

The cost to become an England Athletics Run Leader is £160, and that qualification is yours to keep forever (e.g. if you changed club in the future). The Club can also support, like using sessions for your assessments, having a buddy session with other coaches/leaders (e.g. Ian Salt and Steve Feest leading a session together next week), etc.

Perhaps the Club can make a contribution to people taking the qualification, but we obviously don't have a bottomless pot of money, so – if we did – there will be a fairly small limit on the number of Run Leaders that we're able to fund. Thoughts?

Kit

Our current kit providers, New Balance, seem to have dissolved/disappeared from the planet. Fortunately, all orders had already been received, so we're not losing out financially.

Nick is in the process of going through other potential kit providers, such as Scimitar, Adidas, Ron Hill, and others. We've got a selection of sample kit from a few of these, if people want to have a stroke.

We've still got a number amount of New Balance stock, but unsure how much and what sizes. Nick?
